How to Take part with your class/school:

1. Watch the Christmas Shoebox Appeal video on www.TeamHope.ie (approx. 3 mins)
2. • Use the PowerPoint presentation on www.TeamHope.ie to explain the Christmas Shoebox Appeal to students.
 - Discuss what items can go into a Christmas Shoebox Appeal
 - Allow students to react to the wonderful stories of children receiving shoeboxes
3. Use the resources to take part as part of you TY/ CSPE/ YSI/ Gaisce projects
4. Watch more videos from your video links resource to learn about & discuss the Christmas Shoebox Appeal.

How to build a shoebox:

1. Wrap a box
2. Decide who your gift is for, a girl or boy aged between 2 – 14.
3. Fill your box with lovely gifts using items from the 4 W's list (online and in downloadable resource pack)
4. Add €5 to help us get your box to a child. (Online/cash) & stick on an elastic band to secure the box
5. Arrange a collection (we'll give you your local team's contact details)

Guidance note for teachers:

The Christmas Shoebox Appeal resources deal with the issue of poverty and so should be discussed sensitively in line with the Intercultural Education in the Post-primary School: Guidelines for Schools. These guidelines promote '*representing diversity as a normal part of Irish life and human existence ensuring that representations of minority groups do not focus on the spectacular or colourful events, as this may lead to stereotyping and may run counter to the aim of representing diversity as normal ensuring that all children irrespective of their colour, ethnic group, or ability can feel at home and represented within the school*'.

In line with this, our resources seek to increase students' awareness of global development but also emphasise the diverse and prevalent nature of poverty which can and does impact people of all ethnic groups or abilities. The stories which accompany the Christmas Shoebox Appeal highlight the positive impact of a shoebox on children of all backgrounds and illustrate the examples of our local partners who are changing the societies in which they live and work. Team Hope recognises poverty here in Ireland and does not want any child/family to be put under pressure to produce a Christmas Shoebox.

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Gaisce Bronze Award Community Involvement timetable for the Christmas Shoebox Appeal

Week 1	Launch Week: Order materials from Team Hope and ask if you can speak to different classes about the Christmas Shoebox Appeal
Week 2	Put up posters and plan your talks to classes. Use the DVD & website to get the information you need or get in touch with us.
Week 3	Designate an area to collect boxes & speak to classes/assembly
Week 4	Speak to classes/assembly
Week 5	Speak to classes/assembly
Week 6	Arrange with local coordinator for boxes to be collected.
Week 7	Help out at your local checking centre
Week 8	Help out at your local checking centre
Week 9	Help out at your local checking centre
Week 10	Help out at your local checking centre
Week 11	Help out at your local checking centre
Week 12	Prepare a presentation to report back to classes/community.
Week 13	Present & reflect. What have you learned? What would you do differently if you did it again? What could Team Hope do differently? What was your favourite part? Where do you feel you had the most skills to offer? Send us your notes so we can learn too!

How to make a Christmas Shoebox

1. Wrap a regular sized shoebox. Wrap the box and lid separately (you may use a hinged shoebox or similar size plastic container).
2. Put the sticker from your leaflet (or print one from www.teamhope.ie) and tick the age group and gender. Stick it on the top right hand corner of your shoebox.
3. Fill your shoebox – using items from the 4 W's list. Please only include items that are new or items you would be happy to receive yourself.
4. Include €5 in the envelope of your leaflet (or any envelope) and put it inside your shoebox. Or you can donate it online.
5. Close the shoebox with an elastic band but don't seal it with tape as we have to check each box for custom purposes. Then drop it off by November 10th at one of our 400+ national drop off points! If you have more than 50 boxes please call us and one of our volunteers will collect them!

What is **Young Social Innovator**?

YSI is a youth-lead, team based, action focused program.

Split into a **Senior Program** and **Junior Program**, young people identify social issues of concern to them, explore them, and come up with relevant actions and responses.

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Christmas Shoebox Appeal action project

1. Have your school send shoeboxes to as many children as possible
 - Contact us/visit teamhope.ie to order a leaflet for every student and some posters & resources
 - Ideas: Visit classes/organise an event/make a video to tell everyone
Ask people to bring in shoeboxes made up
Ask people to bring in one item each and make shoeboxes up in school together



2. Create teams. E.g. marketing, logistics, creative, etc. needed to make your project happen.
3. Research the issues around poverty in the countries that the Christmas Shoeboxes go to. (Poverty, Food insecurity, Lack of clean water, Climate change, Gender inequality...) This can be done as part of the **TY Transition Unit: Development Issues: Poverty.**
4. Join the YSI tour and Speak Out!
5. Celebrate during #YSIweek
6. Enter the all-Ireland YSI Awards


Resources needed: Wool, knitting needles, internet/tutorial access


Christmas Shoebox Crafts
